



Requests for accreditation Four Days Marches

Media representatives can request accreditation online from the beginning of June onwards. After we have received your request, you will be sent more information at the end of June about press conferences, the press centre opening times and access to the Four Days Marches.

The following rules apply when submitting a request:

- If a media organisation requires multiple accreditations, a separate request must be submitted for each individual.
- Only those media representatives who can be expected to produce publications about the Four Days Marches shall be eligible for accreditation.
- Persons submitting a request must hold a recognised press pass, or be able to present a letter from their editor.
- Accreditation shall not be granted to persons not holding a demonstrable journalistic position.
- For websites, accreditation shall only be granted to representatives of professionally operating editorial teams. They must be representatives of a website that has demonstrable news value for walking in general and for the Four Days Marches in particular. These websites shall be expected not to sell photo and film material for commercial purposes and must be able to demonstrate that their site generates a considerable amount of traffic. Requests from sites that only offer photo and film material may be assessed separately.
- Accreditation granted for previous editions of the Four Days Marches does not automatically mean that accreditation will be granted again in subsequent years.
- Upon approval of a request, the press pass and other documents shall be presented on site.
- The Four Days Marches press pass must be worn visibly when working at the Four Days Marches.
- Press pass holders working on or in the immediate vicinity of the route shall immediately follow instructions from Stichting DE 4DAAGSE staff and/or the police at all times.
