

2018 Four Days Marches Regulations Governing Start and Sign-off

As adopted by the board on 13 December 2017

Article 1: Duty to check in

1. Prior to the start of the event, there are two check-in days, namely Sunday (13.00 hrs – 17.00 hrs) and Monday (10.00 hrs – 17.00 hrs).
2. All individual participants must check in at the registration desk in person on the check-in days within the times stated so that, for organisational purposes, their identity can be determined and they can be given a carrier with a personal bar code which is to be worn at all times during the event, and cannot be transferred to any other participant.
3. Only participants who are able to present their affixed bar code carriers will be permitted to start the marches. If the bar code carrier has been damaged or removed, either intentionally or through negligence, the participant in question will not be permitted to start or sign off.
4. The leaders of civilian groups and commanders of military detachments must check the group or detachment in on the check-in days prior to the start of the event at the registration desk for civilian groups or the appropriate registration desk for detachments.

Article 2: Individual participants (start location De Wedren)

1. The participants (insofar as they do not come under Article 5) start and sign off at start and finish location De Wedren.
Participants must have their bar code carrier scanned in person for the start to be considered valid.
2. Participants must have their bar code carrier scanned in person at the appropriate registration desk in order for the sign-off to be considered valid.
3. The starting and sign-off times for individual participants are:

04.00 - 04.30 hrs	(50km)	12.00 - 17.00 hrs*
05.00 - 05.30 hrs Or: 06.00 - 06.30 hrs	(40km)	12.00 - 17.00 hrs*
06.45 - 07.15 hrs Or: 07.30 - 08.00 hrs	(30km)	12.00 - 17.00 hrs*

*18.00 hrs on Friday.

Article 3A: Specific regulation governing starting times for 30km

1. The 30km will start in two groups. On the check-in day, all individual 30km participants will receive a bar code carrier, which will also be used to determine the participant's starting time. The starting times are either between 06.45 – 07.15 hrs (first starting group) or between 07.30 – 08.00 hrs (second starting group).
2. The allocation of the starting times is not open to discussion. Starting times are allocated at random. Each participant will have the opportunity to start in the first group on two days of the marches, and will start in the second group on the other two days. Participants are not obliged to start between 06.45 and 07.15 hrs. It is possible to start from any of the four starting gates (on both De Wedren and Vierdaagseplein).
3. Relevant participants will be given a marked checkpoint card enabling them to start in the first group. This card must be shown at the start. It is not personal and therefore may be transferred to another participant before the start. The privilege associated with this card will expire after 07.15 hrs.

Article 3B: Specific regulation governing starting times for 40km

4. The 40km will start in two groups. On the check-in day, all individual 40km participants will receive a bar code carrier, which will also be used to determine the participant's starting time. The starting times are either between 05.00 – 05.30 hrs (first starting group) or between 06.00 – 06.30 hrs (second starting group).
5. The allocation of the starting times is not open to discussion. Starting times are allocated at random. Each participant will have the opportunity to start in the first group on two days of the



marches, and will start in the second group on the other two days. Participants are not obliged to start between 05.00 and 05.30 hrs. It is possible to start from any of the four starting gates (on both De Wedren and Vierdaagseplein).

- Relevant participants will be given a marked checkpoint card enabling them to start in the first group. This card must be shown at the start. It is not personal and therefore may be transferred to another participant before the start. The privilege associated with this card will expire after 05.30 hrs.

Article 4: Civilian groups

- All groups start and sign off at the start and finish location De Wedren.
- Groups start from the Julianapark starting gate. The whole group must report to the start. The order in which groups start is determined by what is customary for each starting point. The start for groups walking 50km and 40km will be split into two blocks within the start periods.
- An affixed bar code carrier must be presented and each group member must have his or her bar code carrier scanned in a correct manner (thus establishing the number of group members) in order for the start to be considered valid.
- Each group member must have his or her bar code carrier scanned in a correct manner (thus establishing the number of group members) in order for the sign-off to be considered valid.
- Groups must be complete both at the start and when arriving at the finish location. If the group is incomplete upon arrival at the finish, any absent group members will be deemed to have withdrawn from the event. Any group failing to sign off correctly before 17.00 hrs (16.30 hrs on Friday) will be deemed to have withdrawn.
- If the bar code carrier has been damaged or removed, either intentionally or through negligence, the participant in question will not be permitted to start or sign off.
- On Friday, the group signs off on the site known locally as 'sport park De Kluis'. The subsequent entry along 'Via Gladiola' is part of the official route.
- The starting and sign-off times for groups are:

04.00 - 04.30 hrs	(50km)	12.00 - 17.00 hrs*
04.30 - 05.15 hrs	(40km)	12.00 - 17.00 hrs*
06.30 - 07.00 hrs	(30km)	12.00 - 17.00 hrs*

*Sign-off at sports park De Kluis on Friday between 11.00 and 16.30 hrs

Article 5: Military participants (start location Heumensoord)

- Participants in the military route (40km green) start and sign off at Heumensoord.
- The exact start point for detachments and individuals is signposted. The whole detachment must report to the start. The order in which detachments start varies according to what is customary for each starting point.
- An affixed bar code carrier must be presented and each participant must have his/her bar code carrier scanned in a correct manner in order for the start to be considered valid. The number of members in detachments must also be established. Each participant must have his or her bar code carrier scanned in a correct manner in order for the sign-off to be considered valid. The number of members in detachments must also be established. Detachments must be complete both at the start and when arriving at the finish location. If the detachment is incomplete upon arrival at the finish, the absent detachment members will be deemed to have withdrawn from the event. Any group failing to sign off correctly before 17.00 hrs (16.30 hrs on Friday) will be deemed to have withdrawn.
- If the bar code carrier has been damaged or removed, either intentionally or through negligence, the participant in question will not be permitted to start or sign off.
- On Friday, military participants starting at Heumensoord will receive their finish scans and rewards on the site known locally as 'Charlemagne'. The subsequent entry along 'Via Gladiola' is part of the official route.
- The starting and sign-off times for participants starting at Heumensoord are:

Start and sign-off:

Tuesday to Thursday

Start: 04.30 – 06.30 hrs



Sign-off: 12.00 – 17.00 hrs

Friday

Start: 03.30 – 05.30 hrs

Sign-off: 11.00 – 16.30 at Charlemagne

Article 6: Failure to sign off (correctly)

Participants who fail to sign off (correctly and in person) before 17.00 hrs (18.00 hrs on Friday) will be considered to have withdrawn from the event.

Article 7: Final provision

Any deviations from these Regulations may only be allowed on the grounds of the Regulations Governing Dispensation.

These regulations shall be referred to as the 2018 Regulations Governing Start and Sign-off.
